What will be Learning?

Literacy- Different ways to read a book (reading the pictures, retelling a story they have already heard and reading the words on a page). Students will be developing strategies to help them become better readers (sounding out words and previewing a book).

Numeracy- we will start with Patterning. Students will be working on recognizing, creating, extending and explaining patterns. Please encouraged your child to look around their environment for patterns that they see. (big, small, big, small. green, blue, green, blue)

On going practice counting by 1's to 50 and counting backwards and from 20 would also strongly benefit your child.

Social Studies – we will be discussing roles and responsibilities. Students will work to discover more about themselves and what their roles are in the school setting and family. We will also find our more about the roles and responsibility of the important people in our school.

Science—we will be focusing on experimenting and using our senses to observe and problem solve. Students will be encouraged to explain what they have observed and what they have learned from their experiments or what they would change.
